### Parody Descriptions

**"Outrageous Makeover: Home Addition w/ Grover"** - a parody of the TV show, "Extreme Makeover: Home Edition."

Grover arrives to make over Fat Blue's house. With a hard working construction crew, Grover adds an additional door to Fat Blue's home giving him two doors. He continues adding and later subtracting doors until Fat Blue is left with zero doors.

**"Scramalot"** - a parody of the musical, "Spamalot."
